

PS: PLEASE DON'T EVER STOP DOING THIS.

At The Core partners with Second Harvest Food Bank to provide weekend meals to hungry kids who depend on free breakfast and lunch during the week at their school. Each child receives a Bite-2-Go kit of food, tucked discretely in their backpack on Friday. Each food kit includes: 2 shelf-stable milks, 2 bowls of cereal, a cup of applesauce and cup of peaches, 2 cans of Chef-Boy-R-Dee pasta: Ravioli and Beefaroni, apple juice, grape juice, package of cheese and crackers, a package of sunflower seeds, and a package of trail mix.

At The Core is committed to:

Provide a Bite-2-Go packs each Friday for 3 years to identified students.

Coordinate delivery of weekend Bite-2-Go packs to the school sites on Wednesdays or Thursdays

Provide ideas for identifying students that would benefit from a Bite-2-Go.

Provide help troubleshooting problems that arise.

Work with schools to develop ideas for Friday distribution of Bite-2-Go packs to ensure child anonymity and ease of program operation on school staff.

Create a bridge between the school and the community group sponsoring the school.

Schools are expected to:

Identify students that would benefit from Bite-2-Go packs.

Distribute and collect permission slips from parents annually.

Discreetly distribute Bite-2-Go packs to individual students.

Maintain the confidentiality of the students receiving At the Core services.

Inform At the Core if your need for Bite 2 Go packs increases or decreases.

Communicate with At the Core any problems that arise with the Bite-2-Go packs or the organization that is sponsoring your school.

Share stories about how the Bite-2-Go packs have helped your students.

Fill out an annual survey about the program.

Children receiving the food are anonymous to those who sponsor them, and to the rest of the students at school. There is not enough room to pen all the stories of children and families who have been helped in the past and will be helped through caring churches, businesses, school staff, and individuals like you. Let us know what questions you have and if and how you want to proceed.
